



What new skills will I learn?

The basis of the work is in attachment and psychoanalytic theory and the application of these ideas in an educational context. Trainees who successfully complete the course can expect to develop a high level of understanding of children and young people with emotional, social and mental health needs that can hinder learning and to develop therapeutic skills in working with them. Opportunities for educational psychotherapists include working with individual children and small groups in school, facilitating nurture groups and working in advisory teams.

Who should apply?

People from a range of backgrounds find the course important in developing skills and knowledge.

This course is for you if you are a:

- classroom teacher in a mainstream or specialist school
- educational psychologist
- learning mentor
- nurture group practitioner
- or a teacher in a specialist unit or support service for children with social, emotional or learning difficulties.

Educational psychotherapy is also suitable for teachers working with individual or small groups of children in an educational, mental health or private setting. **Advanced** Diploma in Educational **Psychotherapy**

Course fees

These are currently £2,800 per annum starting in September 2017, with the cost of the fourth year being slightly less. Fees are generally paid termly in advance. The fees entitle you to free Caspari Foundation membership and associated benefits. Additional costs involve personal psychotherapy and clinical supervision.

An experience of personal psychoanalytic psychotherapy is a requirement for the course. It is expected that this will begin at least a year before the clinical placement and continue throughout it.

Clinical placement

During the second year, one day a week (or two half-days) will be spent in a placement from which the trainee will obtain practical experience in educational psychotherapy.

This usually takes place in a Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS) or similar centre. It will continue for at least two years during which trainees will gain experience of:

- working with at least two children individually
- weekly individual supervision sessions
- working as a member of a multidisciplinary clinical or school team
- attending case conferences and meetings
- engaging in joint/parallel multi-disciplinary team work with family members
- contact with other agencies.

Time commitment

The course takes place over four years. In the first three years, the course comprises three 10-week terms starting in September. In term time, one evening

a week is spent attending lectures and seminars (held at Caspari Foundation), with occasional Saturday lectures and workshops. In the fourth year the course is arranged differently allowing time for individual research and study. Trainees should allow time for, carrying out observations, writing up notes, reading, preparation and completion of written assignments, and keeping an optional reflective journal.

Registration with UKCP

Caspari Foundation is an organisational member of the UK Council for Psychotherapy (UKCP). Graduates who successfully complete the requirements of the course, and who satisfy the Caspari Programme Assessment Board as to their suitability to be therapists working with children, will be eligible for registration as educational psychotherapists with the UKCP. They will then be entitled to work independently as educational psychotherapists, in schools, NHS centres or other institutions.
